



**Living Faith.** Living Faith is a course designed to help people find and grow in the ministry to which God is calling them. It's not meant just for people who are seeking ordained or authorized lay ministry, but for anyone active in church life who wants to grow in discipleship. It is not a basics course, so participants will be expected to have some background in Christian life and thinking. The aim is to help people to apply the Bible and Christian thought to discipleship in their daily lives – in the church and in the world. Courses start early in the New Year, with an induction session on 5<sup>th</sup> or 12<sup>th</sup> January at Church House in Hove. Our local course will run at Holy Trinity Church, Tilgate, on Wednesdays at 7.00 pm on the following dates: Jan 16<sup>th</sup>, 23<sup>rd</sup>, 30<sup>th</sup>, Feb 6<sup>th</sup>, 13<sup>th</sup>, 20<sup>th</sup>, March 6<sup>th</sup>, 13<sup>th</sup>, 20<sup>th</sup>, 27<sup>th</sup> April 3<sup>rd</sup>, 10<sup>th</sup>, May 1<sup>st</sup>, 8<sup>th</sup>, 15<sup>th</sup>, 22<sup>nd</sup>, 29<sup>th</sup> and June 5<sup>th</sup>. Leaflets about Living Faith can be found on the literature table. If you are interested, please take one home and give it prayerful thought. Anyone applying is asked first to discuss this with their incumbent to gain their support for doing the course. So, if you think this might be for you, please speak to Simon. The deadline for receipt of applications for the 2019 course is 17<sup>th</sup> December, so don't delay!
