THOUGHT FOR THE MONTH



March can be an exciting month. This year, no sooner has it begun than Shrove Tuesday is upon us. Later in the month comes the first day of Spring, and this year March comes to a close with our celebration of Mothering Sunday. February ended with snowdrops and crocus in flower, and now the green shoots of March offer the promise of the bluebells and daffodils to

come. Just as bulbs must spend time in the cold ground before emerging, so the season of Lent prepares us for the joy of Easter.

Beginning on Ash Wednesday, 6th March, Lent is a season of reflection and penitence before the celebrations of Easter. By observing the 40 days of Lent, Christians recall Jesus' withdrawal into the desert for 40 days. By tradition, Lent is marked by fasting from food, drink or festivities, but nowadays many of us choose to **take up** something uplifting rather than **give up** something. This is especially appropriate in this, our Diocesan Year of Vocation.

At St. Margaret's there's plenty on offer for us to take up. Simon will lead our Lent course in church on Wednesday evenings, beginning at 7.30 pm on 13th March. Each week there will be prayer, a reading from Scripture, a video with Christians talking about how they try to live in Christ in their daily lives, time for discussion and a practical activity. Each session will be followed by a short service of Compline. Even if you can't manage every week, do please come when you can.

At 11 am each Sunday in Lent, a different speaker will give us a personal account of the life to which they have been called – God's calling; called to teaching; called to healing; called to motherhood – ending on 7th April with a Service of the Word with the theme: Calling You.

It's often said that the more we put into a good Lent, the more we will appreciate Easter when it arrives. May we all enjoy a blessed and fruitful March.

CHOIR SPRING CONCERT, 23RD MARCH AT 7.00PM

(To raise funds for Church Heating Project)

Come and join us on an historical journey, as we sing the liturgical music of St Margaret's since its beginnings round about the 11th Century. At that time England had been overrun by the Normans and there was an increasing recognition of the central role of communion in Church worship. Liturgical music used the Latin and was predominantly in Gregorian Chant form - named after Pope St Gregory I and dating from the 6th Century. The concert will begin with the Gregorian chant, 'Asperges me' used in the sprinkling rite at the beginning of Mass - music that John de Ifelde and Lady Margaret, his wife, whose 14th Century effigies lie at the east end of the nave, would most certainly have heard in their worship. The history of the Church in England over the next 10 Centuries is very tumultuous including, at the Reformation, St Margaret's moving from being a Catholic Church to becoming part of the Church of England. Our music will take us through that period including the renaissance composers Byrd and Tallis, both of whom remained Catholic and survived the period of the reformation in England; the Baroque composers Johann Sebastian Bach, who was Lutheran; and George Frideric Händel, who was Protestant and became a naturalised Englishman; through to the 19th Century Samuel Wesley. By the late 19th Century the different denominations of Christianity in England were established, Catholicism had been made almost fully legal again, and liturgical music was flourishing. We shall continue the journey with works by Edward Elgar, and Sir Charles Villiers Stanford, through John Rutter and John Tavener, concluding with a new piece composed specially for this concert. So our journey brings us right up to the present day.
