THOUGHT FOR THE MONTH



Simon was installed as Vicar of Brockenhurst on Thursday 13th June in St. Nicholas, the Parish Church. This is a small church outside the town and is of a similar age to St. Margaret's. The service was conducted by the Bishop of Basingstoke. We then moved to the much bigger St. Saviour's for the service to continue and for the reception afterwards. Forty-two people

from Ifield and Gossops Green attended with most travelling by coach that got us back to Ifield on the stroke of midnight.

This mean that the 'interregnum' (pause, interruption, hiatus, wait etc) has begun. In simple terms the Parish of Ifield is now without a Rector and until a new one is appointed the Rural Dean and Churchwardens act as 'sequestrators'. In this role they are in charge and responsible for all that goes on in the parish. This includes finding clergy to celebrate at all our normal services. Thankfully we have two able Self-Supporting Ministers (SSMs) (Daphne and Margaret) who are very willing to provide coverage though we are mindful of the need not to overload them. For this reason I have invited other clergy from the surrounding area to occasionally preside and preach.

For the parish the interregnum is a time of coming together and sustaining our mission, so we remain an active worshiping and prayerful community. We may no longer have Simon with us as our leader, but we do have our Saviour as an example to follow and need to remember that we are all disciples and called to proclaim the Gospel in thought, word and deed. If you have any issues that need addressing then in the first instance, pastoral matters should be addressed to Daphne or Margaret while any other matters should be raised with either me or Rob Pudney as the Churchwardens. In summary this is a time for us all to pull together for the common good and make our parish an attractive place for a new priest to want to come to.

The process of finding a new priest has now begun with the first draft of the 'Parish Profile' being worked on. This provides an overview of who, what are where we are as a church and will contain a person profile setting out the type of priest we are looking for. Once this has been approved by the PCC it goes to the Bishop and Archdeacon who will then consider it and hopefully recommend clergy who they think would be suitable for this parish to formally apply for the position. If the subsequent interviews are successful, an appointment will be made, but if not it may be that the post will have to be advertised.

All this takes time and for that reason I have already drawn up a clergy rota that goes into 2020. You will be pleased to know that the Christmas services are now covered and only a few slots in the autumn remain to be filled, so from a worship point of view services will continue unchanged apart from the faces at the front. I am aware that many have already expressed joy at our visiting clergy and would encourage you all to make them feel really welcome and appreciated as they help us through the interregnum – and remember to thank Margaret and Daphne as they, too, help to keep things going on an even keel.

The mention of Christmas probably brings shivers to some of you, but I have 'good news'. The new heating system in now installed and the opening covered. Commissioning of the system will take place in early July so we can look forward to a warm church on cold winter days — now there is a Christmas present to look forward to!
