

Sue Edgson and Chris Bell, as the parish representatives, together with the Bishop of Chichester and the acting Archdeacon of Horsham recently met by ZOOM with a candidate for the post of Rector of Ifield.

We are delighted to be able to tell you that following the unanimous decision of the panel the Bishop is pleased to announce the appointment of the Reverend Christine Spencer as our new Rector designate.

Christine is currently priest-in charge of St. Richard's, Three Bridges who are also being advised of Christine's new appointment today. Because of the Coronavirus restrictions and the fact that the Rectory is currently occupied we are unable to say when Christine will be Licenced and Inducted into the parish. We will of course advise you as soon as those plans are made.

Parish Electoral Roll update – we would encourage you to complete an Electoral Roll form. Being on the Electoral Roll does not entail you taking on any additional commitments, however it does help the church show its strength. Representation on the governing bodies of the church depends on the number on the electoral roll. Joining the Roll

gives you the right to attend and vote at the APCM (annual parochial church meeting). It enables you to help in the democratic choosing of who stands on the decision making body of your church!

Due to Covid-19, the APCM has been postponed until later this year (date to be confirmed). Therefore the deadline for return of electoral roll forms has been lifted as the roll cannot be closed earlier than 28 days before the APCM. pccsecretary@ifieldparish.org or by post to the Parish Office. NOTE: If you have already joined the Roll at St Margaret's in 2019 then you need do nothing further. If you are not sure if you are on the electoral roll, Clare is happy to advise.

PCC and Deanery Synod Representatives - Your Parish needs you! We are looking to elect 5 PCC (Parochial Church Council) members at our Annual Parochial Church meeting (APCM) - revised date yet to be agreed. The PCC is the governing body of our church and is a charity. As such, the PCC members are the Trustees. You can become a PCC member if you are aged 16+, baptised and on the electoral roll. In addition, we need to elect 4 Deanery Synod lay representatives. Completed nomination forms for both these posts (available for download from our website www.ifieldparish.org) need to be returned to Clare Wilson before the APCM.

All are welcome to attend the APCM – this is in an important meeting in the life of our church.
