

## REMINDER OF OUR BAPTISM CALLING

At our Lord's baptism in the river Jordan God showed himself to all who have eyes to see and ears to hear. The Father spoke from heaven, the Spirit descended as a dove and Jesus was anointed with power from on high. Here is the door of faith, through which we enter the kingdom of heaven. As children of God, we are adopted as his sons and daughters, and called to proclaim the wonders of him who called us out of darkness into his marvellous light.

*Water is poured into the font with these words*

God in Christ gives us water welling up for eternal life.  
With joy you will draw water from the wells of salvation.

**All Lord, give us this water and we shall thirst no more.**

*The president stands before the water and says*

Praise God who made heaven and earth,



### **Finance 2018**

The final figures for 2018 show that a small deficit of £409 was incurred. The budget had been set for a no profit/loss situation. The income for December was swollen by receipts from the Heating Appeal - £1823.89 was received and this will be transferred to a separate account shortly. A further £125 has been received this month (Jan 2019).

Expenditure includes £3720 paid to the Architect. Normally this would have been paid out of the restoration account but as the Revenue account was in a better state than anticipated it was decided to pay the invoice from there.

Mission expenditure includes a share of Christmas offertories donated to Open House and The Children's Society (£842 in total). The Diocesan contribution of £62700 was met in full.
