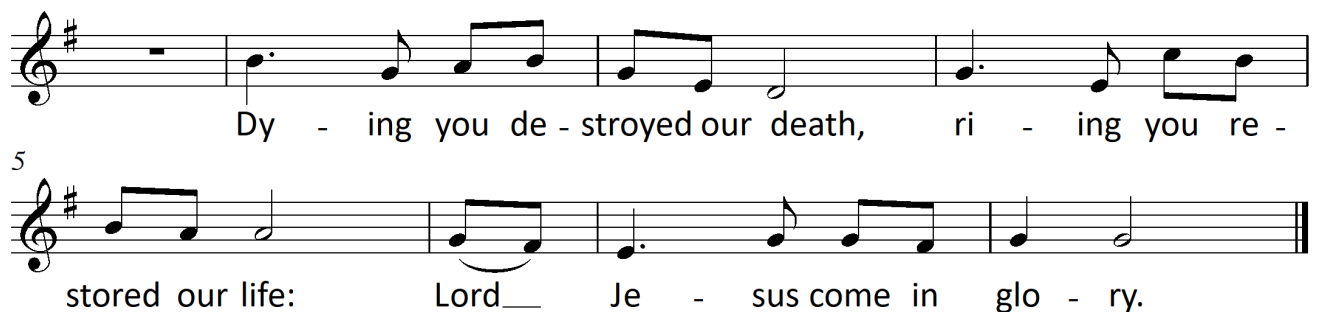
Celebrant Lord, you are holy indeed, the source of all holiness;
