The BBC Radio 4 Today Programme has recently been running a series of items on childhood holidays - the sort of holidays we used to enjoy before so many of us sought sunshine abroad. Sir Michael Morpurgo remembered simple holidays in the Scilly Isles, walking, swimming, looking at birds, reading books, talking, walking ... His lasting memories are of the colour of the sea, the sound of oystercatchers, the sight of gannets diving for fish, the flowers and the history. On another day, Victoria Hislop

recalled holidays in Sussex – sandwich lunches on the beath, being cold for long periods of time (she said the reason she now loves Greece so much is Bognor Regis) and hiring a cabin-cruiser on the River Medway where her father entrusted her to keep a log, recording everything they did from the time it took to get through each lock to what they ate on their river-bank picnics.

I, too, remember being entrusted by my father to keep a log, in my case the times and distances between specific places as we drove in our Morris Traveller from Sussex to our favourite seaside village in Devon. I have fond memories of that log-book. It had a dark green, hard cover and was used for many years, so that each year we could compare details of the journey. Roads were much quieter then, but progress was slow. There were no motorways and few dual carriageways. We used to stop overnight and then set off early the next morning to avoid the worst of the traffic on the dreaded Exeter by-pass.

Well I remember the pride I took, as the elder daughter, in maintaining that log-book. Not only was I honoured that my father trusted me to keep it faithfully, but I wanted to honour him by completing it to the best of my ability.

In a similar way, we are all called to take care of what has been entrusted to us by our heavenly Father. This past eighteen months of restricted foreign travel have forced us to take advantage of the glorious, varied landscape of our own country, and to seek new ways of holidaying which are kinder to, and more respectful of, the beautiful world our Creator has given us.
